Back to the webinar





Many of you attended the webinar organized by the MEDAE network on November 26, 2024 around the prospects for supporting the deployment of agroecology in public policies in North Africa.

Summary of webinar

Agriculture in North Africa faces a number of economic, social and environmental challenges (population growth, urbanization, heavy dependence on agricultural imports, climate change, soil degradation and pressure on natural resources, youth employment challenges, etc). While agroecology is practiced locally by many farmers and can provide a relevant response to these multiple challenges, how are public policies facilitating or hindering the agroecological transition in North Africa?

Through three presentations, this webinar analyzed the place of agroecology at local level (in agricultural practices), national level (in public policies) and international level (in the Rio international conventions). A discussion period provided an opportunity to exchange views on the prospects for supporting agroecology and ways of fostering the agroecological transition in North Africa.

Back to the UNCCD COP16

The MEDAE network was present at COP16 of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD), which took place from December 2 to 13, 2024 in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. We organized a side event on December 4 on the theme: Securing food systems in North Africa: prospects for supporting the deployment of agroecology in public policies.

Following a presentation of the challenges facing agriculture in North Africa, and a review of public agricultural policies in the region, a round table bringing together a wide range of players (civil society, local authorities, donors, international organizations, etc.) provided an opportunity to take a cross-sectional look at the challenges and prospects for supporting agroecology in North Africa.
