### Back to the webinar

How can agroecology be a lever for strengthening women's empowerment in North Africa?

On April 22, the MEDAE network organized its 7th webinar, bringing together 70 participants who were able to attend presentations and exchange ideas with five agroecology professionals from the agricultural and research sectors.

The webinar highlighted the crucial importance of women in North African family farming, particularly through their role in knowledge sharing (especially between generations) and their capacity for innovation in the production, processing, and marketing of agricultural products. Several barriers to the socio-economic empowerment of these women were identified in relation to social norms and public policies, and areas for improvement were identified to enable North African women to contribute fully to the agroecological transition of their territories.

# Tunisia, Algeria, Morocco : back to the cross-visits

Between January and April 2025, three cross-visits organized as part of the NATAE project were held in Tunisia, Algeria, and Morocco. Thanks to the hospitality and organization of the host structures - INAT (National Agronomic Institute of Tunisia), El Argoub association, and ENAM (National School of Agriculture of Meknes) - participants were able to discover several farms practicing agroecology or conservation agriculture in different agroecosystems in North Africa: cereal plains, oasis systems, and mountains.

The visits were organized around specific issues that allowed participants to focus on the integration of legumes into cereal systems, soil fertility, water management in the face of drought, the processing and valorization of agricultural products, and the adaptation of local knowledge and know-how.

## **New NATAE** publication



CARI and El Argoub association, which is responsible for implementing NATAE activities in the Laghouat living laboratory (Algeria), have developed a position paper highlighting the benefits of agroecology in ensuring sustainable incomes for producers in oasis systems facing the impacts of drought.

Entitled "Promoting agroecology as an appropriate response to the challenges of drought in oasis systems," this advocacy document highlights the results of several studies that have demonstrated the impacts of agroecological practices on water resource management and soil quality. Recommendations are also made to promote the development of agroecology as a response to the challenges posed by climate change.
